Earth Day Founder John McConnell to be honored at Vernal Equinox Celebrations in Laguna Beach March 20~21, 2007

LAGUNA BEACH, CA — A series of unique environmental and educational events are scheduled for **John McConnell**, the 91-year-old founder of **Earth Day**, when he and his wife **Anna** visit Laguna Beach in March to be honored by the City Council on the Vernal Equinox, March 20. The day following this "Earth Day" celebration, McConnell will participate in a panel discussion with a number of other noted environmentalists.

On March 20 at 6:00 p.m., at the Laguna Beach City Hall, McConnell and Endangered Planet Gallery will present a proclamation to the Mayor and City Council that designates the City of Laguna Beach as an "Earth Trustee City," a concept developed by McConnell during the decades since he and United Nations Secretary General U Thant first established International Earth Day in 1971.

On March 21, at 6:30 p.m. in the Forum Theater at Laguna Beach's Festival of Arts, a panel discussion will focus on "Earth Trustee City" goals and future actions. In addition to John McConnell, the panel will include **Joanne Tawfilis**, executive director of the United Nations Association of the USA, San Diego chapter; **Greg O'Loughlin**, Environmental Committee of Laguna Beach; and **Charles A. White, P.E.**, Director of Regulatory Affairs for the Western Area of Waste Management. The panel will be introduced by Laguna Beach Mayor **Toni Iseman**. The panel moderator will be **Harry Huggins**, VP Director of Endangered Planet Foundation.

An environmental film and an appearance by flute prodigy **Evren Ozan** are also scheduled. The event is free and open to the public, but seating is limited and

Other activities of the week will include a public gathering on Main Beach at 4:45 p.m. on Tuesday, March 20, to mark the official time of celebration of the Vernal Equinox, which this year is at 5:07 PM PDT. Prior to this event, a reception for the McConnells will be hosted at Endangered Planet Gallery from 3:00 – 4:30 p.m.
